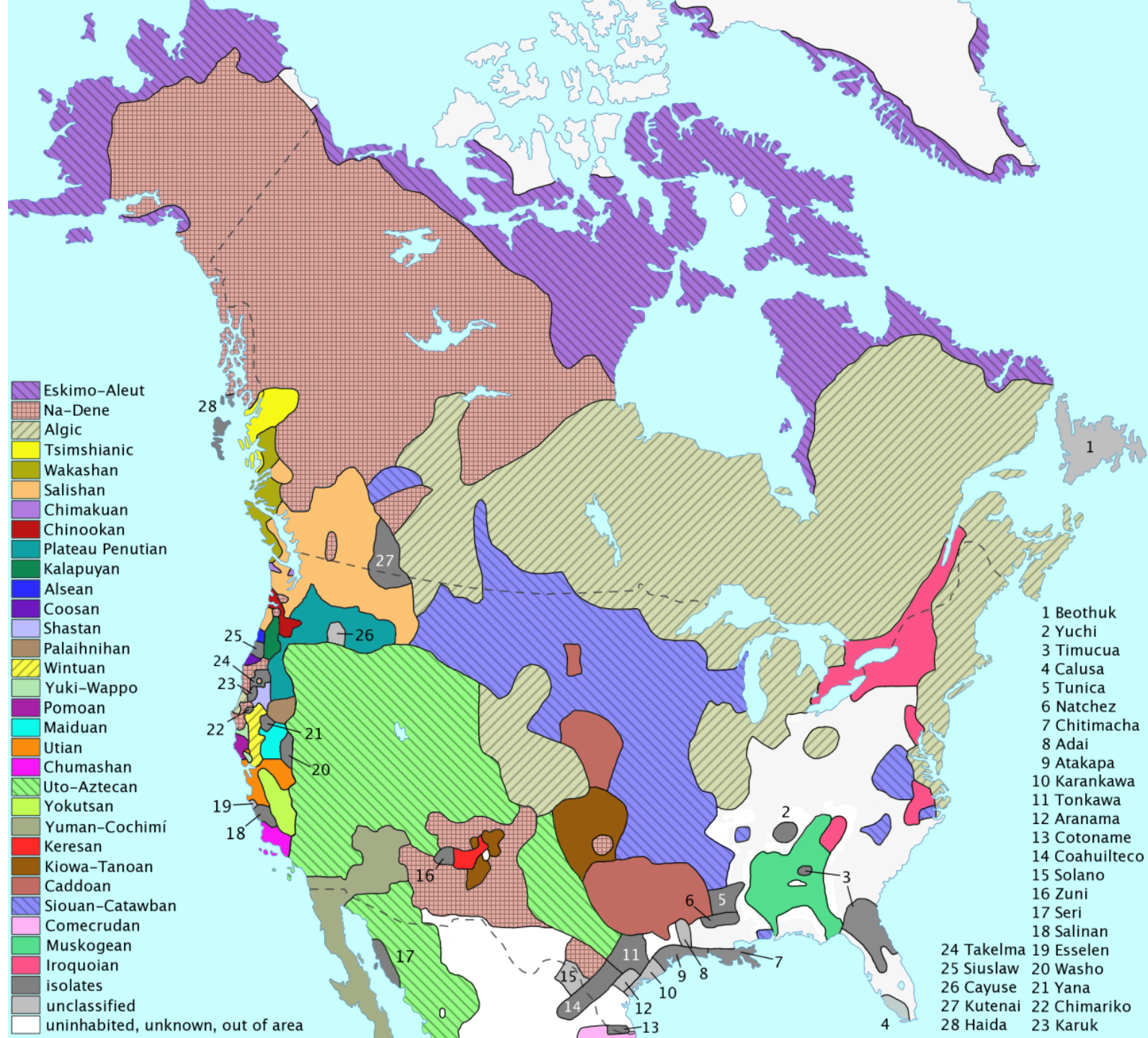

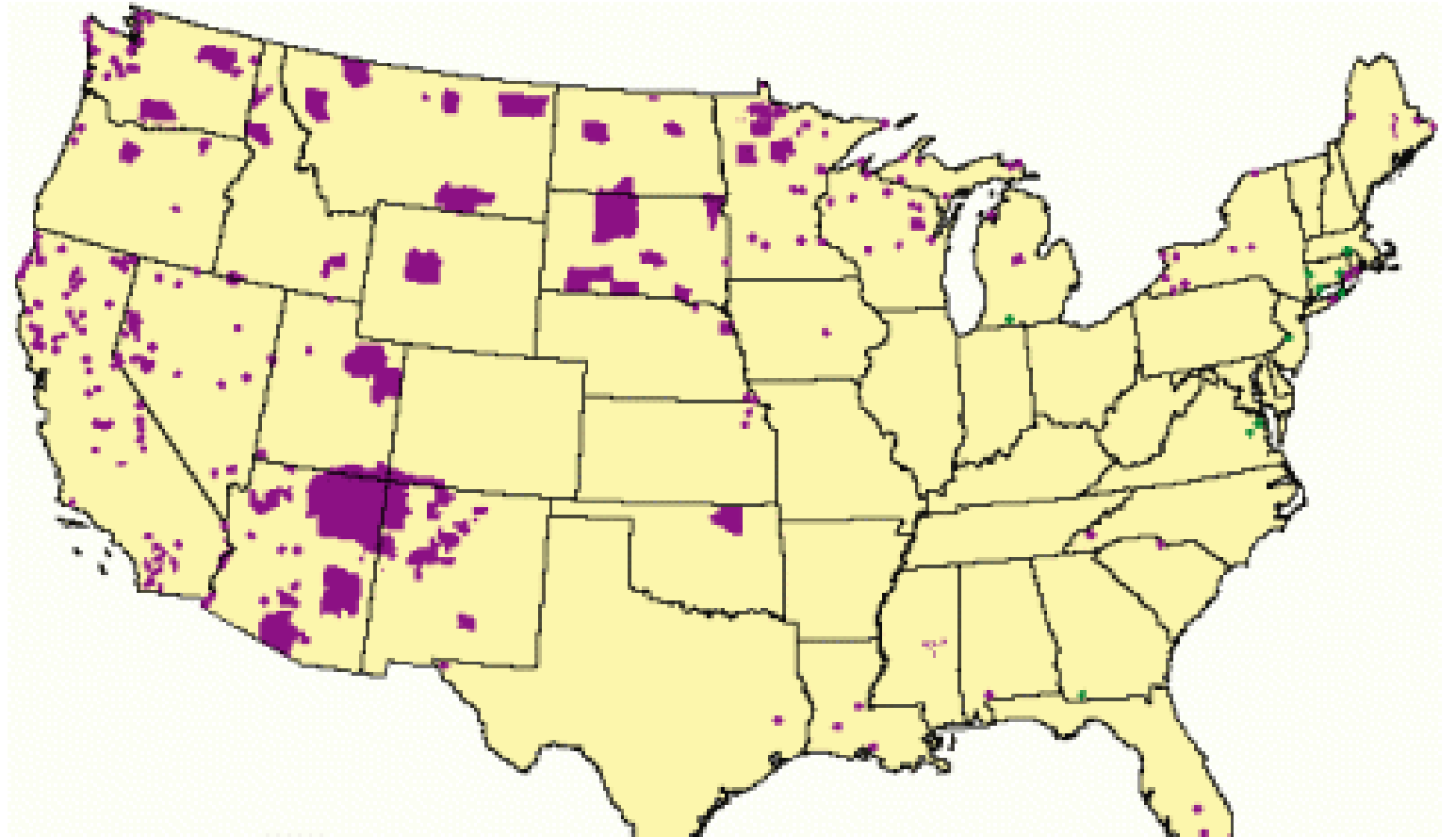
The Constitution and American Indians
